The first annual meeting of the North Carolina Library Association was held in Charlotte at the Colonial Room on November 11-12, 1904. The meetings were annual until 1925 when the association shifted to a "Conference" every two years. Papers presented at the first meeting included: "The Necessity for Cooperation Among the Libraries of the South," "The Library as an Educational Factor," "The Public Library and the Public School," "The College Library," and "The Library and the Women's Club." Some 67 people attended this first meeting of the new state association. A Treasurer's report was given by Louis Round Wilson.

We will again meet for our 57th "Biennial" Conference on October 16-19, 2007 in a new conference venue in Hickory. Featured speakers include: television host David Holt, the North Carolina Poet Laureate Katherine Stripling Byer, the State Librarian of Arizona Gladys Ann Wells, Red Clay Rambler Bland Simpson, along with authors Sharyn McCrumb, George Guidall, Glenis Redmond. The conference promises to be an exciting one and librarians throughout North Carolina should make plans to attend.
